After talking to another Fisher family on the perks of participating in the manna program, this year we have decided to make a concerted effort to get Manna on a regular basis. Yes, we originally made the effort because of the fundraising fee. But, once we saw how easy it was, we saw how it was a win for everyone. The school made money, and we have money going towards our tuition. We mainly buy gift cards for groceries, gas and take-out, but we have used it for birthday gifts as well. # Why Participate?

Manna is our #1 School Fundraiser! It is essential to help with operating costs and maintain incremental, necessary tuition increases. The school fundraising requirement per family is to raise \$300 FOR THE SCHOOL through manna sales. BONUS, meeting this requirement would result in about a \$450 tuition credit for you each year!

## How it works:-



You buy gift certificates and shop with them. Hundreds of retail establishments available.



The retailer gives a percentage of the card value to SJF (2-14%).



You get 60% of the retailer rebate credited to your tuition at SJF, high school or college.



SJF gets 40% of the retailer rebate towards meeting operational costs.

# How to get started:

#### In-person

- 1. Complete Manna Program Sign Up Sheet and submit during Manna hours (below).
- 2. Print out order form to purchase local gift certificates. **Manna Form**
- 3. Visit the convent (102nd and Fairfield)

Monday 8-9:30 a.m. Wednesday 6-7:30 p.m. Thursdays 8-9:30 a.m. Friday on school days only 2-3 p.m. Saturday 8:30-9:30 a.m. Sunday 10:30-11:30 a.m.

#### Online (via website OR App)

- 1. Before you begin, please email sifmanna@gmail.com for SJF Enrollment Number! This is key for Manna to track users. They respond quickly!
- 2. Register on www.shopwithscrip.com to use the website version AND/OR download the RaiseRight by Shopwithscrip App.
- 3. Shop! When you're ready to check out, sign up for secure online payments by linking a bank account (through Prestopay), adding a credit card, or both. (You may use a check for an in-person physical gift card pickup). Submit order by 10a.m. Sunday to pick-up starting Wednesday.
- 4. Use your cards! eGift cards are delivered to your Wallet (on website and/or App) within minutes. Physical gift cards are mailed to your coordinator (the convent!) and these can be reloadable (find out more **here**). Use both types in-store and online!

Did you know that the **Invest in Kids Act** helps children from low-income households in Illinois access scholarships that cover up to 100 percent of a Catholic school's tuition? Thousands of students are gaining knowledge and building on their faith in Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools thanks to this program. Your support during these challenging times would help educate the next generation in Catholic students while building on a brighter future for all.

#### What is a tax credit scholarship?

Tax Credit Scholarships cover up to 100 percent of tuition and fees for the 2021/22 school year. Students from low-income households can qualify for tax credit scholarships if their family income is less than \$72,900. More than 9,000 students qualified for a scholarship last year and 6,300 were left waiting without one.

#### **Cut tax liability**

Individuals and corporations may receive a credit for their Illinois state taxes equal to 75 percent of donation.

#### **Triple your impact**

Donate to a school or all archdiocese schools between Dec. 1 and Feb. 28, 2021, and, thanks to a few generous donors, your donation will be matched and maximized threefold! Limitations apply.

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

We use \$10K in this example, but any amount is needed.

#### 2 RESERVE

Reserve your tax credit with the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR). Refer to this list of **eligible schools** to determine where your school of choice is located and designate Empower Illinois as your Scholarship Granting Organization. You will receive your Contribution Authorization Certificate (CAC) via email. Once you have your CAC, you are ready to donate.

#### **3 DONATE**

Once you receive confirmation of your tax credit and your CAC from IDOR, you have up to 60 days to donate to Empower Illinois. For more help, refer to page 7 of this **step-by-step guide**.
