Dear SJF Families,

Welcome back! I hope your family had a lovely Thanksgiving and a fun and relaxing break! On to Christmas! We have a busy month of activities on the calendar as we anticipate the birth of Jesus and all of the joy that preparing for Christmas brings. You can literally feel the excitement from our students as we transform our classrooms and hallways into Winter Wonderlands. Our Falcons' curriculum has also shifted to Christmas themes such as Advent in Religion, Christmas around the world in Social Studies, reflecting and writing about family Christmas traditions in ELA, and painting and shaping Christmas trees in Art to name a few. We are eager to bring back our pre-k and kindergarten Christmas shows as well. We look forward to celebrating all of the magic with our Falcons and sharing this beautiful season with all of you!

As you are aware, we are experiencing an uptick in positive COVID-19 cases at SJF and in our neighborhood. Many of our students are testing positive. Please keep your child home if they are not feeling well. We are all working toward transitioning to a sense of normalcy both in and out of school and collectively are hoping and praying for an end to the COVID lifestyle in our near future. However, we are not there quite yet. In order to keep our school doors open, and provide our extracurriculars a hope at having a season, we need to follow the rules set forth by the archdiocese. Proper mask wearing and staying home when sick are the two most critical priorities of the Arch's COVID Task Force's plan. Following these rules will lead to a greater chance of our kids continuing to learn in person, our teams playing and competing, and our clubs holding meetings and events. As a community, let's commit to these two priorities so that we can give our children the gift of a sense of normalcy while growing up during this unique and unprecedented time. COVID GUIDANCE & REMINDERS

- If your child or a household member has been diagnosed with COVID-19, please call the school office, 773-445-4737, during the school office hours, 7 a.m. 3 p.m. and/or email attendance@sjfschool.us.
 - If you contact the school office outside of regular scheduled office hours, we will get back to you the next business day. Thank you for your patience!
- A few details to highlight:
 - o All symptomatic individuals must remain home, regardless of vaccination status.
 - o If symptoms last longer than 24 hours, individuals must receive a negative COVID-19 test or alternative medical diagnosis prior to returning to school.
 - Masks are required for all students and staff indoors regardless of vaccination status. This rule INCLUDES athletes, coaches, and spectators indoors at sporting events.
 - A *close contact* constitutes being within 3 feet of a positive individual, un-masked for more than 15 minutes. If your child is considered a close contact, you will be contacted separately and will receive specific quarantine guidance.
 - Updated Athletic Guidance per the Archdiocese: If a student athlete tests positive, all of his/her teammates will be considered close contacts and will be required to quarantine. If a teammate is vaccinated and asymptomatic, he/she will not need to quarantine.
 - In addition to proper masking, SJF cleans and sanitizes desks and tables multiple times throughout the day. Our classrooms are cleaned daily. Our building is deep cleaned every weekend. Our students sanitize their hands upon entering and exiting the classroom/lunchroom. We are following the archdiocese guidance and working hard every day to ensure our children and staff remain healthy and safe.
- Please review the most recent communication from the archdiocese <u>linked here</u>. These guidelines will be reviewed every two weeks and are subject to change.

Athletics

To ensure SJF is able to host athletic competitions and that our teams are eligible to compete, we need everyone's cooperation and assistance in adhering to the COVID protocols established by the Archdiocese COVID-19 Task Force.

- ALL spectators, coaches, players and gym staff must wear masks in the gym and school building during all games and practices.
- As a reminder, if your child misses school due to an illness (fever, throwing up, headache, etc.), he or she cannot attend that day's athletic practice or game.
- Please ensure your children represent SJF well as they compete and cheer on other Falcon teams. Good sportsmanship matters!
- Student conduct in the gym, on the stage, and in the hallways during sporting events outside of school hours continues to be an issue. Garbage is left all over the stage, stairways, and hallways. Please remind your child to take pride in our school and pick up and throw out his/her garbage. Students should not attempt to enter any part of the school building while they are attending athletic competitions at SJF.
