2020 Accomplishments

When you appreciate all that you have, what you have appreciates. And we have much to be thankful for!

- We completed our 11th week of school and our entire first trimester in-person!
- <u>Teacher and Staff SHOUT-OUT</u>: Thank you to our resilient, talented, professional and flexible teachers and staff who have demonstrated incredible teamwork through such an uncertain year. You roll with and bounce back from every challenge that comes your way. You are essential workers, in the trenches, making a difference in our kids' lives. Thank you for showing up each day. Your efforts are nothing short of heroic.
 - A special thanks to <u>Mrs. Maxwell</u> and <u>Mrs. O'Shea</u> who are leading our <u>Remote</u> <u>Learning Team</u>, ensuring every teacher is confident and prepared to teach remotely when the time comes.
 - Our 12:45 dismissals on Wednesdays are reserved to prioritize <u>teacher collaboration</u>, <u>professional development and goal setting</u>. <u>Danielson Evaluations</u> continue this year with a school-wide focus on: student relationship building and rapport and closing the academic gap as a result of the pandemic.
- Student SHOUT-OUT: In the face of significant adversity, our unbelievable students arrive to school with a smile on their face, a positive attitude and an eagerness to learn during the most unique circumstances. Their grit and tenacity are unmatched and inspiring. They overcome so many obstacles each day to be successful. They are the reason we are here. Thank you for motivating us to always bring the best version of ourselves to school for you. You are amazing!
- <u>Parent SHOUT-OUT</u>: Thank you for your willingness and ability to adapt to our everchanging protocols and guidelines. We feel the love, support and commitment you have for our school community and we could not do this without you! Your child's remarkable attitude reflects all of your efforts at home. For that and much more, we commend you!
- Students in grades <u>Kindergarten 8 will be 1:1</u> with technology in early 2021. We were able to utilize our Title Funds to secure these devices. Up until last year, students in grades 6-8 were 1:1.
- <u>12 Smart Panels</u> have been purchased through the use of our <u>ESSER Funds</u> and a generous donation from the <u>Family School Association</u>. Each panel will be installed in our 5th 8th Grade classrooms over the Thanksgiving Break. A huge shout-out to <u>Dave Cahill and the Holy Name Society</u> for delivering the panels to each classroom last weekend.
- Our <u>New Reading Curriculum</u>, <u>Into Reading and Into Literature</u>, has been adopted and implemented in grades Kindergarten-8. We are already seeing a change in our students' test scores!
- Despite the challenges of the spring, the majority of our <u>students are at or above grade</u> <u>level in our iReady assessments</u>. Thanks to our parents' commitment to this tool, each student is averaging 45 minutes a week, completing their individualized lessons.
- Many of our 8th Graders are taking advantage of our <u>HSPT Class</u> preparing our students for the upcoming Catholic High School Entrance Exam. The instructors are <u>SJF Faculty</u> members, <u>Mrs. Condon</u>, <u>Mrs. Folliard</u> and <u>Ms. Dunlavy</u>, who together have a <u>combined 35 years of formal test prep experience</u> at Huntington Learning Center, Academic Tutoring Center, Excel Edge and Sylvan.

- Congratulations to our patient <u>Third Graders</u> who finally made their <u>First Holy</u>
 <u>Communion</u> this past fall. Their original date was cancelled due to the pandemic.
- Our <u>Junior High</u> Students continue to complete their <u>service hours</u>, helping those around them, and participated in a <u>Confirmation Retreat with Fr. Tom McCarthy</u>.
- Two of our Junior High Students won 1st and 2nd place in the Fran Hurley Art Contest.
- Through the Leadership of our SOAR Student Ambassadors, as a <u>schoo</u>l we <u>raised over</u> <u>\$900</u> in support of <u>Veterans</u> and the Fisher House Charity and <u>over \$2,000</u> to support, <u>the Bracken Family</u> from St. Cajetan.
- In an effort to create a sense of normalcy for our students, Ms. Schiavone, Mrs. O'Shea and our SOAR Students facilitated a spirit week celebration in September, a virtual pumpkin decorating contest in October, and an American Flag Hunt on the grounds of our campus in celebration of Veteran's Day in November.
- We continue to prioritize our students' <u>religious formation</u>. - FREE COVID TESTING: The 19th Ward and Northside Clinical Labs will offer FREE COVID TESTING for 19th Ward residents on Saturday, November 28th from 9am 2pm at Olivia's Garden, 10730 S. Western Avenue. Testing will be offered indoors, utilizing an appointment system to control spacing and crowd sizes. This event will use the standard nasal swab with results expected within 72 hours. COVID Reminders


- The Archdiocese announced that all *Catholic elementary schools will be remote learning* from January 6th through January 15th with a return to in-person learning on January 19th. Please see the details of this important announcement <u>linked here</u>.
- Masks: Please make sure your child's mask fits appropriately. Masks must fit snug and cover his/her nose and mouth. Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe!
- Thank you for communicating with the office and faculty regarding your child's absence. Please be mindful that if/when you e-mail a teacher or the office during the day regarding your child's make-up work, we may not be able to respond to you until the end of the school day. We will happily respond as soon as we are able. Thank you for your patience!
- If a student or student's immediate family member is awaiting a test result from the lab AFTER YOU RECEIVED THE RESULTS FROM A RAPID TEST, the student(s) must remain home until the lab results are returned and confirmed.

- Quarantined Cohorts: Please be aware that <u>there is a process that we go through in order to quarantine a classroom</u>. This process includes communication and direction from the Archdiocese as well as the CDC and IDPH and can take several hours to complete. When we become aware of a positive COVID case in our community <u>we act as quickly and communicate as promptly as we are able</u>. We are so grateful for your patience and understanding.

- The Archdiocese has enacted a new policy that if a family knowingly sends their child to school when they are positive for COVID-19, the family will be subject to our remote learning option for the remainder of the school year.
- As a reminder, here are answers to some of our most frequently asked questions:
 - o If a student becomes ill at school and has 1 or more COVID symptoms, the student and his/her siblings will be sent home. The School Office will send an e-mail to parents communicating that in order for their family to return back to school, parents must share documentation of a negative COVID test result or a doctor's note indicating that the diagnosis is not COVID related.
 - When a student is absent due to an illness, the School Office will e-mail the parents:
 - If the symptom(s) persists for more than 24 hours, the School Office will send an e-mail to parents communicating that in order for their family to return back to school, parents must share documentation of a negative COVID test result or a doctor's note indicating that the diagnosis is not COVID related.
 - Homework cannot be sent home with neighbors or friends, but CAN BE SENT HOME WITH SIBLINGS. Please connect with your students' teacher(s) to coordinate missing work.
 - When picking up your child early from school for whatever reason, parents are expected to wait outside the main office doors.
- If your child's classroom has to quarantine, you only need to quarantine his/her siblings if he/she is showing symptoms of COVID-19. In an effort to keep everyone safe and protect our school community at large, please communicate with us any documentation you receive from your doctor regarding your child's symptoms/illness. In order to keep everyone safe, we must always make cautious decisions with the well-being of those around us at heart. Thank you for working with us!
- Please partner with us and keep your children safe while outside of school. If we all follow this guidance, we will have a greater chance of keeping our doors open. While your child is not in school, please remind him/her to wear a mask, keep his/her distance, wash and sanitize his/her hands, and stay home if he/she is sick.
- This year you need to <u>reserve your spot for Extended Day Care</u>. Due to the new Covid Safety Guidance, we can only serve 50 students at a time. <u>Here is the form</u> to reserve your spot.
