#### Did you know...

- SJF provides countless opportunities for additional enrichment and remediation after school?
- Students in grades 2<sup>nd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> can take advantage of our Homework Club facilitated by Mrs. Ade, Mr. K, and junior high student mentors on Tuesdays and Wednesdays throughout the school year <u>at no additional cost to our families</u>.
- Academic Eligibility Club is open to our students in grades 5<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> who need additional support in one or more subject area. In the past at SJF, during progress checks at the mid trimester, if a student in grades 5<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> had one (or more) F or two D's on their progress report, he or she would automatically be removed from any SJF sanctioned extracurricular activities until his/her grades were satisfactory. In today's climate, that policy simply isn't what is best

for our Falcons. Now, students who fall into this category are automatically enrolled in our **Academic Eligibility Club** where they work closely with Ms. Dunlavy and Mrs. Larmon on Tuesdays and Wednesdays after school for an hour to receive the support they need to be and feel successful! While attending this club, students are allowed to remain in their extracurricular activities. This support is offered at <u>no additional cost to our families</u>.

- Homework Club and Academic Eligibility Club allow our Falcons to receive the academic support they need, improve their executive functioning, organization, and communication skills. Through goal setting our students are able to plan for future success while building their confidence and self-esteem. During this time our students learn about and practice self-advocacy and how to successfully work with a partner or small group.
- This year we have expanded our ETC classes to include Falcons in grades K-8. Our ETC's include Chess Wizards, Novel Studies, Stem and Steam Classes, Holiday Cooking and Baking Classes, Games, and Arts and Crafts. *There is a fee associated with these classes*. Be on the lookout for information and registration for our ETC's in our newsletter.
- SJF Offers a prestigious **High School Entrance Exam Test Prep Class** that spans over 8 weeks leading up to the Catholic High School Entrance Exam. SJF's HSPT class is taught by 3 of our very own faculty members, Mrs. Condon, Mrs. Cummings, and Ms. Dunlavy who have a combined 40 + years of test prep experience. *There is a fee associated with this class*.

Our goal is that through these differentiated offerings, we are able to further

support and prepare our Falcons for their bright future!

#### **COVID GUIDANCE**

#### We are in this together...thank you for your cooperation!

- Please review the most recent communication from the archdiocese <u>linked here</u>. These guidelines will be reviewed every two weeks and are subject to change.
- A few details to highlight:
  - All symptomatic individuals must remain home, regardless of vaccination status.
  - If symptoms last longer than 24 hours, individuals must receive a negative COVID-19 test or alternative medical diagnosis prior to returning to school.
  - $\circ$  Masks are required for all students and staff indoors regardless of vaccination status.

#### **Compliance Update**

#### 2021-2022 SCHOOL VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

The following guidelines are mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago and apply to all volunteers, chaperones, coaches, scout leaders, and catechists that will help out in our parish and school programs. The Archdiocese of Chicago conducts an annual audit to ensure that all are in compliance with these mandates. That audit is happening now. If you wish to participate with our students as a volunteer, chaperone, and/or coach, please make sure you have completed all the necessary tasks.

If you are planning to volunteer, chaperone, and/or coach at St. John Fisher School this year, here are the Safe Environment Requirements:

- New volunteer/chaperone/coach: Create an account on the Virtus System at <u>www.virtusonline.org</u>.
- If this is a new account, you will be assigned the online *Protecting God's Children Training*.
- Register and attend the training within 15 days of beginning volunteering.
- If you have a VIRTUS account from another parish/school, please notify Mary Margaret Redmond to add St. John Fisher School to the existing account.
- If your Protecting God's Children is older than 2018, you will be assigned the online recertification training, *Keeping the Promise Alive* through the <u>VIRTUS website</u>. This recertification is *done online*.
- **Name-based Criminal Background Check** by S2Verify submitted in <u>VIRTUS</u> which is a one-time requirement, but rechecked every three years.
- Archdiocesan Standards of Behavior for Church Personnel working with Minors and Vulnerable Adults (Formerly Archdiocesan Code of Conduct). This must be read, signed and re- acknowledged yearly through <u>VIRTUS</u>.
- Completion of a *CANTS 689 Form* <u>linked here</u>. This must be completed every year and turned into school; DO NOT MAIL.
- Complete the online *Mandated Reporter Training* through <u>www.archchicago.org</u>.
