We are currently seeking new members of the School Advisory Board for the 2020-2021 school year. All applications must be received by **Friday, June 15, 2020** to be considered.

The School Advisory Board will consist of 8-12 members, serving terms of up to three consecutive years. Members are expected to attend monthly meetings and participate in a Board committee. Committees include Strategic Planning, Finance, Communications and Marketing, Mission Effectiveness and Enhancement, and School Advancement.

Members agree that they will use their talents, gifts and insights for the common good of the community to promote the mission and goals of Catholic education. They will defer their personal agendas in order to discern with other members the issues, concerns and challenges they face in meeting the educational needs of the students. Not only will they take seriously their role as advisors to the pastor and principal, but also they will accept the conditions of membership on the school board, namely the Code of Ethics, which describes the parameters of their collaboration and responsibility.

Guidelines for all archdiocesan schools are developed by the archdiocesan school board and administered by the superintendent of schools. At the parish level it is the responsibility of the pastor and principal to see that such guidelines are followed in the parish school. Decisions for our school, then, are made by the principal and pastor, the faculty, staff, parents and school advisory board, following guidelines set forth by the Office of Catholic Schools of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

SJF Manna Earnings Requirement for 2020-2021 School Year

As previously announced, the fundraising fee (\$175) has been eliminated and we are introducing a **requirement to “earn” \$300 of MANNA credit** for the school before the end of the academic year. You can begin earning as of June 1, 2020. Tuition alone does not cover the school’s expenses. Proceeds from Manna help make up the difference between school operating costs and tuition. **MANNA is our single largest school-specific fundraiser**, and participation in it has severely dropped in recent years to the point where less than 35% of our current school families regularly use it. We’re hoping that introducing a requirement to earn credit for the school through MANNA will be a positive boost for both our budget and yours. For every \$1 you earn for the school, you also earn \$1.50 credit toward your tuition bill. **It’s a Win-Win!** Please email sjfmanna@gmail.com with any questions about the Process. Both offerings are very important and beneficial to the school and we appreciate your support!

There are 100+ retailers participating so we recommend taking a look at the list to decide what will work well your family within your normal routine. Dollars highlighted in **blue** must add up \$300 for the school to reach its goal and when we do, we will earn **\$100,000 for the school with no added cost to you. 
