Brian Jacob Sitko, 2nd Grade




SJF's "Falcon of the Week" is 2nd grader, Jacob Sitko.





WHAT IS CUB SCOUTS?

Cub Scouts is a fun-filled program for boys and girls grades K-5.

From the thrill of transforming a block of wood into a race car or launching a rocket, to the satisfaction of improving the community or making a new friend, Cub Scouts is full of meaningful adventures you and your Scout can enjoy together.

Scouts will go fishing, hiking, and earn badges all before the end of the year!

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The registration fee to join Scouting is \$33 annually (prorated from the time you sign up through the end of the year) plus a small insurance fee.

There are also one-time uniform costs and nominal activity fees that may be charged by your local group.

These costs may be offset by fundraising and financial support for those who qualify.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Your family will become part of a local group called a pack that meets once a month for adventures, activities, and recognition of achievements.

The pack you choose is up to you. While there are likely many packs in your area, parents often decide to join the one closest to their child's school.

Your Cub Scout will also be part of a smaller group within the pack, based on grade and gender, that meets a few times each month for age-specific activities.
