





HSPT Entrance Exam Prep Course

An HSPT Entrance Exam Prep Course will be offered to interested 8th grade students. SJF instructors will review all 5 sections of the exam: Verbal Skills, Mathematics, Reading, Language and Quantitative Skills. The students will learn time management skills which are crucial for the HSPT and all standardized tests. Instructors will teach important problem-solving strategies and work to review and strengthen students' content knowledge during the prep course.


