HALLOWEEN GUIDELINES AT SJF

- No short skirts or shorts, mid-drifts, bare shoulders or low necklines.
- Students cannot wear anything that is disrespectful or depicting violence in anyway.

- All costume preparations must be done at home. Applying makeup or colored hairspray at school is not allowed.


