
Fisher Parent Helps Students Apply Real World Applications to ELA

Mr. Michael Clancy was kind of enough to join the 8th graders last week as part of their cumulative project to studying To Kill A Mockingbird. For Mrs. Nash's ELA class, the 8th graders read and studied To Kill A Mockingbird and participated in many accompanying projects in order to develop a deeper understanding of the novel. Mr. Clancy is an expert criminal defense attorney, like that of the main character in the novel, Atticus Finch. Mr. Clancy addressed the many important aspects of the novel, but emphasized how Atticus did such a phenomenal job defending Tom Robinson that not only is he role model for attorneys in this capacity, but he is also a role model for all, as he emphasizes and embodies the need for change in our country against prejudice of any kind. Mr. Clancy was able to make many relevant connections to the novel which was published in 1960, but was set in the 1930's Jim Crow South, and our modern day world. We are so grateful for this unique experience and to hear the important perspective Mr. Clancy has on the most revered novel as well as our justice system today.
