Dear Fellow St. John Fisher Parishioners, Parents, Alumni, and Friends,

One year ago, we publicly launched **The Fisher Falcon Education Foundation** with a simple letter just like this one. While not flashy, we hoped it would explain why the Foundation's establishment was so important to the future of St. John Fisher. We had confidence in the generosity of our community, but admittedly, we were nervous about how big of an impact we could have in our first year as we humbly asked for your support. We shouldn't have been so nervous. It will come as no big surprise that our expectations were exceeded, and so, it is with a great sense of gratitude and extreme hopefulness about the Foundation's long-term potential that we write again this year.

Through a mix of year-end gifts in response to this letter, matching gifts from donors' employers, ticket sales for the inaugural Oktoberfest, families remembering loved ones with memorial bequests to the Foundation, and alumni collecting for our cause at formal class reunions and informal get-togethers alike, **the Foundation raised over \$100,000** to add to our previously reserved savings in our first year of operation. **THANK YOU! THANK YOU! THANK YOU!**

As important as the raising of the funds, though, is the **immediate impact** those funds have made on the lives of our students, faculty, and staff of St. John Fisher School. Specifically, the Foundation helped provide the following financial support to SJF in the last year:

- \$30,000 to complete the purchasing of interactive "smartboards" for all SJF classrooms
- \$20,000 to award our Class of 2022 Msgr. McElligott Scholarship winners
- \$35,000 to cover SJF tuition costs for families in financial need
- \$75,000 to subsidize the School's 2022-23 operating budget

Every single penny donated is appreciated, and you can be confident will ultimately be invested 100% directly into our beloved School's successes, of which there are so many. Amidst an unprecedentedly challenging backdrop of COVID-related disruptions and distractions these last two years, it has been simply amazing to witness how much the School has achieved under the leadership of Mrs. Nash and Mrs. Larmon, with the helping hands and hearts of our dedicated and talented faculty and staff, and in partnership with our hardworking students and parents.

The recently published National Assessment of Educational Progress reports highlighted how Catholic schools nationally have outperformed traditional public schools in combatting learning loss from COVID and show "how community-focused, mission-driven leadership can benefit children," according to an article in the *Wall Street Journal*. In fact, "**if all Catholic schools were a state, their 1.6 million students would rank first in the nation across the NAEP reading and math tests for fourth through eighth graders.**" Those trends are equally apparent at St. John Fisher. They are a testament to our faculty meeting the challenges of COVID-era teaching head on, and importantly, in person, and investments in our children's future continuing despite the myriad of other emergency issues school leadership faced. For example, two years ago, the decision was made to invest in a full-time Reading Specialist position and the introduction of a school-wide reading curriculum. These investments are showing fantastic results: our *median* progress against expected learning growth in reading last year was 112%, and 70% of our students met or exceeded their grade-level standards in reading vs. 30% state-wide in Illinois. Similar progress is earlier stage but ongoing in math, where additional investments like those for the reading program are targeted in the coming years.

These types of successes don't mean everything is perfect, however, or that there is not a persistent need for more to continue to compete and produce at the highest level. And it's not more of one thing; it's honestly more of everything – more capital to invest into ongoing curriculum and technology refurbishment, more resources to better support the diverse and individual learning needs of our students, and more money to go into the pockets of our teachers to name just a few of our most pressing priorities. The Illinois State Board of Education reported that last year, the Chicago Public Schools spent over \$20,000 per student. In comparison, at St. John Fisher, our average tuition and fee revenue per student was just over \$5,000. This is a meaningful funding gap that we nonetheless have overcome, but to continue the legacy of achievement and advancement SJF has for so long embraced, we need that spending limit per student to go up. We just don't want to and don't believe it's fair to put that burden solely on our tuition-paying families.

This is where the Foundation comes in, and where you, our fellow parishioners, alumni, and friends, come in. **We all benefit from the continued success and vitality of St. John Fisher School.** All our lives are enriched by the daily presence in our community of eager and excited young minds challenging themselves to grow academically, athletically, and in lives of faith and service to God and each other. We cannot take that presence for granted. It requires continued commitment to sharing each of our gifts – whether time, talent, our treasure – with our next generation of Falcons as so many before us have shared with us.

The Fisher Falcon Education Foundation is the primary channel through which you can give such a financial gift to St. John Fisher School. As you can read in the enclosed pages or on our website (www.FalconEducationFoundation.org), it is the key coordinator among our many efforts to seek creative, alternative, and capital-efficient ways to finance the increasing operating costs of our School.
