





The food drive will begin on Saturday, March 30th. Here is a rough outline of the drive and the times we are asking you to lend help to this worthy cause.

<u>Saturday April 6th</u> – Teams will go through the neighborhood and collect canned goods from front porches. These items will be collected and brought back to SJF. Separate teams will assemble and fill boxes back at SJF. These will be loaded into a truck and then delivered to food pantries. We again anticipate the time commitment will be 9:00-11:00 AM.
