I would like to take this time to thank you for your continued support for our partnership with St. John Fisher and your hot lunch program and for the trust you have put in us to feed your children! This is an endeavor in which we take great pride. We're extremely excited to begin our 3rd school year serving the St. John Fisher community.

With the continuous increase in labor costs and subsequently the increase in food costs, Gilhooley's is implementing a price increase in hot lunch and milk. We are adjusting the price of hot lunch to \$4.95 and milk to \$0.50. Decisions like this are not made easily and without doing everything on our end first to ensure there is no other choice. We consider the impact to everyone involved. This price increase not only applies to St. John Fisher, but all our grade schools.

We will continue to specialize in cooking homemade, from scratch meals. Freshness and quality will never be sacrificed. In our kitchen you will always see whole grains, unprocessed meats, and fresh produce. Once again as the year progresses, we will be updating the menu and offering new choices from our home-style recipes. We aim to keep the children happier than ever with the selection of meals!
