2. St. John Fisher will be included in **6Essentials** later this year. It is a pilot program the Archdiocese. It is an evidence-based system used to drive school improvement. Currently the 5Essentials is used in Illinois public schools and is based on more than 20 years of research by the University of Chicago Consortium on School Research. The research-based survey identifies five indicators that can lead to important student outcomes. Research has shown that schools strong on these indicators are 10 times more likely to improve student learning. More information will be shared when available.
